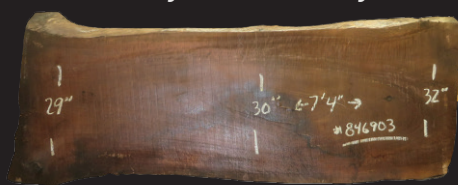

### Circassian Walnut (*Juglans regia*)

Also known as "Common Walnut" or French Walnut. Heartwood ranges from light to dark browns, sometimes with gray, purple, or red casts.



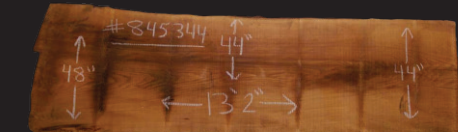
### Walnut (*Juglans nigra*)

Incredibly popular among woodworkers. Stable and strong. Heartwood ranges from light brown to dark chocolate brown. Its color can have a gray, purple, or red cast.



### Redwood (*Sequoia sempervirens*)

Heartwood ranges from light pink brown to deep red brown. Sapwood is a pale white yellow.



### Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*)

Arguably the most popular hardwood in the U.S. Hard and strong. Heartwood is light to medium brown with a red cast.



### Eucalyptus (*Eucalyptus globulus*)

Colors range from light yellow brown to grayish white, and sometimes display orange and red hues. Good results with both hand and machine tools.



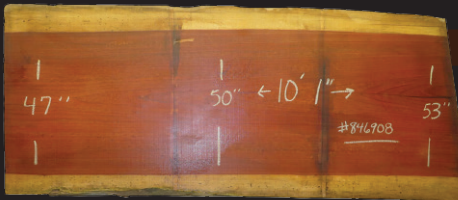
### Keyaki (*Zelkova serrata*)

Yellow white sapwood and yellow brown, almost a light gold heartwood. Strong and durable.



### Koa (*Acacia koa*)

Light to dark brown with distinct golden streaks. Works easily and comparably to Teak. Easily takes high lustrous finishes, sands smooth and glue well.



### African Padauk (*Pterocarpus soyauxii*)

Heartwood colors can vary, ranging from a pale pink orange to a deep brown red, or even purple. Considered a very durable wood.

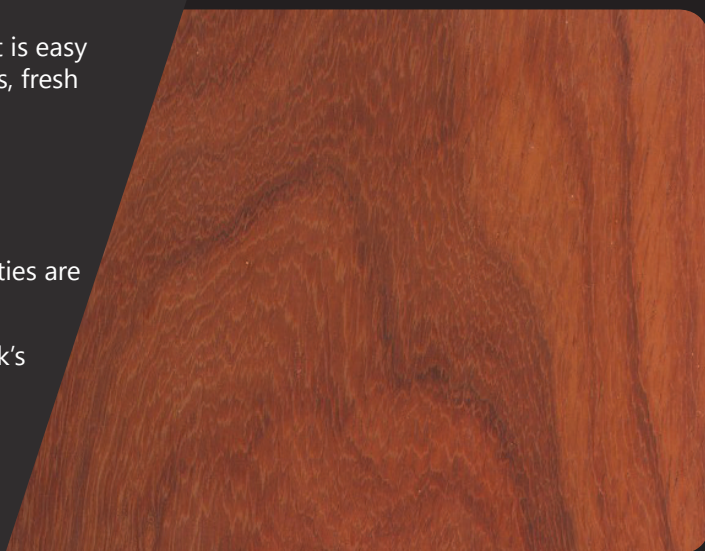

## working African Padauk

**African Padauk** is a very durable, strong and dense wood. Overall, it is easy to work; it turns, glues and finishes well. **We recommend** sharp tools, fresh sandpaper, masks and proper air ventilation when working.

- Works well with both hand and machine tools.
- Wear a mask when sanding.
- Predrilling is recommended - nail-holding & screw-holding properties are rated as very good.
- Be mindful when finishing alongside lighter woods - African Padauk's brilliant reds can bleed and discolor lighter woods.
- When finishing, use an UV inhibitor to reduce the wood's natural tendency to darken to maroon with age. Although this process is unavoidable, it can be slowed down.
